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Coaching Days

On the Thursday prior to each race meeting we generally run a Coaching day for a maximum of 25 senior riders and up to 10 Junior riders. These days are generally run by Leo Cash and Dave Fuller. Each Coaching Day we would generally only require one or two volunteers to help with the paperwork in the morning and assist the coaches in the running of the day.

Track Days

The Friday before each race meeting the club runs a Track Day for up to 100 riders. At each Track Day we require the following volunteers/Officials:

- Practise Supervisor (MA Lic Req)
- Timekeepers
- Scrutineers
- Pit Exit Marshal
- Pick Up Vehicle Staff
- Flag Marshals

Accommodation

In 2012 we will have the following options available:

1. Stay at the track, camping is free for officials.
2. Advise the club that you will organise your own accommodation and receive \$40 per day of work towards the cost.
3. Stay in the accommodation provided by the club. This will require you to share rooms with other officials. You will need to advise us that you need a bed two weeks prior to the event so we have sufficient accommodation arranged.

What we will provide

Often on the Saturday evening we try and organise a meal for our officials, we will notify you on the Saturday morning of each event if this is happening.

You will be taught how to use the flags and radios and if working as a flaggie for the first time will be placed with an experienced official.

The club will run a raffle at each meeting for the officials, you will all receive a ticket when you sign on and we will draw the raffle each Sunday at lunchtime. You could win discount vouchers for Coaching/Track days, Polo shirts, movie ticket and many other prizes.

In 2012 we plan to run our own official of the year competition where you will be given points each time you volunteer during the year. The winner will then be announced at the end of year presentation night.
