- ANNOUNCEMENT:** The Motorcycle Sportsmen of Qld Inc., hereafter called the CLUB will conduct the 2012 Warwick Challenge Cup for road racing solo machines and sidecars at MORGAN PARK RACEWAY, WARWICK on the 18th and 19<sup>th</sup> February 2012. This will be an interclub meeting that current financial members of The Motorcycle Sportsmen of Qld, Townsville Motorcycle Club and Qld Early Motorcycle Sports Club shall be eligible to compete. All **Senior and Junior** racing will be in a clockwise direction using the **FULL CIRCUIT**.
- JURISDICTION:**
  - The abovementioned meeting has been authorised by Motorcycling Queensland who has issued the Motorcycling Australia Permit Number 40428 and is open to holders of current Motorcycling Australia Club or National Junior or Senior Licences. Junior 125GP Competitors with a suitably endorsed licence are also permitted to compete. **ONE MEETING LICENCES** will be issued at these events. **Junior competitors must produce their Motorcycling Australia Log Book before being eligible to compete.**
  - The meeting is to be held in accordance with the current 2012 Manual of Motorcycle Sport (GCR's) as issued by Motorcycling Australia, these Supplementary Regulations, the By-Laws of MQ and any Final Instructions approved by Motorcycling Queensland.  
**BY ENTERING THIS MEETING, ALL PARTIES AGREE TO COMPLY WITH THESE RULES, REGULATIONS, BY-LAWS AND INSTRUCTIONS.**
  - Authority to use the course has been granted by the Warwick & District Sporting Car Club Inc. and the Southern Downs Regional Council.
- ENTRIES:**
  - Entries open forthwith and close last mail**  
**Friday 10<sup>th</sup> February 2012**
  - In the case of postponement or abandonment of the meeting, all or any part of the entry fee may be retained by the Club, if such retention is approved by Motorcycling Queensland.
  - Only entries received on the attached **OFFICIAL ENTRY FORM** and accompanied by the correct entry fee will be accepted.
  - NOTE:- LATE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AND THE RETURN OF ENTRY FEES FOR ANY RIDER WITHDRAWING FROM THE MEETING IS AT THE DISCRETION OF THE CLUB.**
  - WITHDRAWING FROM MEETINGS MUST BE MADE BY SUBMITTING A WRITTEN REFUND REQUEST 7 DAYS PRIOR TO THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE OF THE CLUB. THIS MUST RECEIVE A CONFIRMATION OF RECEIPT FROM THE CLUB BEFORE IT IS ACCEPTED. WITHDRAWALS WITHIN 7DAYS PRIOR TO THE EVENT MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A MEDICAL CERTIFICATE.**

#### 4. INSURANCE:

- 4.1. National Personal Accident Insurance Scheme provides for basis cover with regard to death and permanent disability. Refer to the 2012 Manual of Motorcycle Sport for details.
- 4.2. Ambulance insurance is compulsory for all competitors.
- 4.3. It is strongly recommended that competitors give due consideration to taking out Personal Accident Insurance or Weekly Benefits Insurance.

5. **MEDICAL SERVICES :** Queensland Ambulance Service will be onsite from the commencement of any on track activity until fifteen minutes after the last event.

#### 7. CLASSES OF COMPETITION:

#### 8. ENTRIES TO CONSTITUTE A CLASS:

- 8.1. To constitute a Class, the number of contestants entered and competing in each Class shall be ten (10).
- 8.2. Should there be insufficient entries in any Class of Competition, **the decision to run or cancel the Class, or to combine events and re-distribute any awards and / or prize money, will be at the discretion of the club, subject to Motorcycling Queensland approval.**

#### 9. RACE FORMAT AND OFFICIAL PRACTICE:

- 9.1. Qualifying Groups, Race Format, Race Length and Schedule of Events will be notified in Final Instructions.

#### 10. CHALLENGE CUP CLASS MACHINES AND RIDERS:

- 10.1. The Warwick Challenge Cup will be run under the following rules.
  - 10.1.1. Qualifying will be held for all competitors in capacity based groups of 24 riders on Saturday morning. Each group will be given two(2) qualifying sessions of 12 minutes.
  - 10.1.2. Each competitors fastest time will then be used to group riders into Divisions.
    - 10.1.2.1. Each Division be made up of Eight (8) riders. For example, if you qualify 13th fastest you will be in Division 2.
    - 10.1.2.2. You will only be competing against the other seven(7) riders in your group.
    - 10.1.2.3. Griding will be in Divisions with two(2) spare rows between each Division. For example if you are 13<sup>th</sup> Fastest you are in Division 2 in Grid Position 21. All Divisions on the Grid will start at the same time.
    - 10.1.2.4. Grid positions will remain static for the whole weekend.
    - 10.1.2.5. There will be a maximum of 24 competitors on the track in each race.
    - 10.1.2.6. Brake Caliper bolts to be lockwired or taped/fastened in the tightened position
    - 10.1.2.7. Remove Glycol/Coolant from Radiator – only water allowed (easy for street bikes to remove, save in a container and place back into bike after event.)

- 10.1.2.8. Bike side/centre stand to be cable tied up in the up-position or REMOVED.
  - 10.1.2.9. Sump plugs, caps and filters, which, if removed, permit the discharge of any lubricating, cooling or hydraulic fluids must be lock-wired, taped or secured in the fastened position.
  - 10.1.2.10. Catch trays must be fitted
  - 10.1.2.11. Mirrors must be removed, lights, glass, indicators to be removed or taped
  - 10.1.2.12. No gear racks, sacks or panniers
  - 10.1.2.13. Number/registration plates to be removed
  - 10.1.2.14. Your Riding Number is to be placed on the front fairing, and both sides of the rear tail fairing. These can be made using contact so can be removed easily after the event.
- 10.1.3. Riders who fail to record a qualifying time may be seeded in any position on the grid at the discretion of the Clerk of Course with agreement from the club.
- 10.1.4. Riders who have not raced previously will be required to attend the Track Day on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> February 2012 so they can be assessed as competent to race.**

## 11. MACHINES AND RIDERS:

- 11.1. All machines entered must comply with the current GCR's for Road Racing Competition.
- 11.2. Multiple entry of the one Machine in the same Class of Competition is not permitted.
- 11.3. Any rider may change his/her machine prior to the start of each race provided the following points are adhered to:
  - 11.3.1. Change of machine will be permitted only if the request is submitted in writing to the Clerk of Course and with the approval of the MA Steward at least 20 minutes prior to the start of the event in which the change is required.
  - 11.3.2. No rider may change to a machine that has not been ENTERED in the meeting. There is provision on the entry form for spare machine details to be entered.
  - 11.3.3. All spare machines must be scrutineered prior to use.
- 11.1. Machines found to be emitting fluid of any description WILL be excluded. Engine breathers must be fed into a vapour trap of at least the same capacity as the engine capacity. Radiators must be filled with water. (NO COOLANTS OR GLYCOL SUBSTANCES OF ANY DESCRIPTION ARE TO USED IN COOLING SYSTEMS)
- 11.2. All machines must be fitted with an effective engine kill switch.
- 11.3. Any machine involved in an accident must be re-presented for machine examination prior to continuing with the days events.
- 11.4. Machine examination will take place from 7.30am on Saturday at the track.
- 11.5. All machines are must be presented on Saturday for Scrutineering.
- 11.6. Metal valve stems or shortie rubber stems are mandatory in all tubeless tyre applications.
- 11.7. PLEASE REFER TO THE 2012 MANUAL OF MOTORCYCLE SPORTS RULES 15.3.1.4 IN REGARD TO FLUID CATCH TRAY REQUIREMENTS. THESE RULES WILL BE ENFORCED.

## 12. RIDING NUMBERS:

- 12.1. Wherever possible, competitors will be allocated their Preferred Riding Number. Every effort will be made to allocate this number, however, the club reserves the right to allocate numbers at its discretion. Lists of competitors and their riding numbers will be available on the website [www.motorcyclesportsmen.com.au](http://www.motorcyclesportsmen.com.au) at least four days prior to the event.
- 12.2. All machines shall be fitted with three number plates, one on the front of the machine and one on each side of the machines towards the rear as per the 2011 Manual of Motorcycle Sport rules.

## 13. GRID POSITIONS:

- 13.1. Grid positions will be determined by lap times from official timed PRACTICE held on Saturday.
- 13.2. Grid positions will be STATIC. (This grid position will be used for all races.)
- 13.3. Spare positions on the grid will not be filled.
- 13.4. Competitors who enter late or who do not complete an event or participate in practice may be placed on the rear of the grid at the discretion of the Clerk of Course.

## 14. RIDERS BRIEFING:

A Riders Briefing will be held prior to the commencement of racing and ALL Competitors MUST attend the Riders Briefing. Details will be included in Final Instructions. Riders will be required to sign on at the conclusion of the briefing. Riders not present or in special circumstances not having a representative WILL be excluded from the days racing. This may also apply if the mandatory sign on at Riders Briefing is not completed. **SMOKING IS NOT PERMITTED AT RIDERS BRIEFING.**

## 15. DRUG AND OR ALCOHOL TESTING:

- 15.1. All competitors and officials are advised that as part of the MA drug education program, drug testing may take place at any competition in accordance with the Australian Sports Commission policy as implemented by the Australian Sports Drug Agency.
- 15.2. If any doubts exist over banned substances, it is recommended competitors telephone the Drugs in Sport Hotline on 1800 020 506. When drug testing takes place, the payment of prizemoney and the distribution of awards may be delayed at the discretion of MQ until the results of the tests are known.

## 16. CODE OF CONDUCT:

- 16.1. All Competitors, Officials and Parents are reminded of the Motorcycling Australia by-law – CODE OF CONDUCT (as stipulated in the 2012 Manual of Motorcycle Sport) which is a guide to appropriate behaviour at all motorcycle race meetings. This **CODE OF CONDUCT** applies to this meeting and will be **ENFORCED**.

## 17. TIMETABLE:

- 17.1. **To be notified in Final Instructions.**
- 17.2. For the purposes of drug and alcohol testing, the commencement of the meeting shall be deemed to be 7.00am Saturday with the completion of the event for participants being 30 minutes after the completion of the final event.

## 18. CIRCUIT DESCRIPTION:

- 18.1. Morgan Park Raceway is constructed of hot mix asphalt, the full circuit has a track length of 2.9km. The Motorcycling Australia Track License number is MA 10-627. **All races will be run in a clockwise direction.**

## 19. COURSE INSPECTION:

- 19.1. All competitors will have the opportunity of walking over the length of the course to be used for racing prior to practice commencing, for the purposes of familiarising themselves with the layout and condition of the course. Competitors who having walked the course, have any grievances with the condition of the course should advise the Steward or Clerk of Course immediately following their inspection.

## 20. STARTS:

- 20.1. All starts will be by light or raised flag. All starts will be by clutch. The light sequence will be RED to OFF. All competitors will start when the RED light is EXTINGUISHED.
- 20.2. A horn will sound and a 2 minute board will be displayed at the pit gates when riders are called on to start their warm/up sighting lap. After the display of the 2 minute board a horn will sound at 30 seconds, the pit gate will remain open for **30 seconds** only.
- 20.3. All riders not already on the circuit when pit gate closes will be starting from pit lane under the direction of the Clerk of Course with no sighting/warm up lap.
- 20.4. Time is of a premium at this meeting therefore any rider deliberately wasting time on the sighting lap will be dealt with by the Clerk of Course.

## 21. NOISE:

- 21.1. All machines must comply with a 102dBa static and the 2012 Manual of Motorcycle Sport rules. Machines repeatedly over 102dBa may be unable to compete until the noise is reduced to the accepted level.

## 22. SPECIAL NOTES AND WARNINGS:

- 22.1. Protests will be lodged as per the 2012 Manual of Motorcycle Sport rules.
- 22.2. There will be timing equipment utilised at this meeting.  
**All Senior competitors must have a \$50 CASH OR CHEQUE refundable deposit to be able to hire the required transmitter.**  
**All Junior competitors must hand in their licences and log books in lieu of the \$50 deposit for the required transmitter.**
- 22.3. Fuel is not available at the track.
- 22.4. Body Piercing must be covered with tape or removed.
- 22.5. Alcohol is not permitted within the pit or paddock area. Riders concerned will be excluded from the day's events.
- 22.6. Children on wheeled devices of any type are not permitted in the pit area. These devices will be confiscated and may incur a \$50 fine.
- 22.7. Children under the age of 16 years are not permitted in pit lane at any time, unless a competitor.
- 22.8. Enclosed toe shoes must be worn in pit lane.
- 22.9. No dogs other than guide dogs are permitted within the circuit grounds at any time.
- 22.10. Power leads may **not** be plugged into the tower or carports at any time. You will be required to supply a generator. **THE NOISE LIMIT FOR GENERATORS IS 90dBa. GENERATORS WILL BE TESTED AT SCRUTINEERING. Competitors with generators exceeding 90dBa when tested within the carports, will be required to pit in the paddock area.**
- 22.11. The club recommends that all competitors have a suitable fire extinguisher.
- 22.12. Garages are available for hire by ticking the appropriate box on the entry form.
- 22.13. **Carports must be pre-booked on your entry form.**
- 22.14. Personal Data logger/ data acquisition systems/ transponders are not permitted.

## 23. CARPORTS:

- 23.1. **Are ONLY available by booking and paying on the official entry form.**





## CONTRACT TO PARTICIPATE IN THE 2012 WARWICK CHALLENGE CUP

**WARNING! THIS IS AN IMPORTANT DOCUMENT WHICH AFFECTS YOUR LEGAL RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS, PLEASE READ IT CAREFULLY AND DO NOT SIGN IT UNLESS YOU ARE SATISFIED YOU UNDERSTAND IT.**

1. I THE UNDERSIGNED (see below): [Insert Name]

HEREBY AGREE with Motorcycling Australia Limited ("MA") that I am by this agreement entitled to participate in the motorcycle activity/meeting listed in Schedule 2 (hereinafter called "the Meeting" or the "Event") at the venue listed at Schedule 3 (hereinafter called "the Venue") on the terms and conditions set out in this document.

**2. DEFINITIONS** In this declaration:

- a) "Claim" means and includes any action, suit, proceeding, claim, demand, damage, cost or expense however arising including but not limited to negligence but does not include a claim against a Motorcycling Organisation under any right expressly conferred by its constitution or regulation;
- b) "Indemnites" means and includes the persons, organisations and bodies corporate whose names appear in Schedule 1.
- c) "MA" means Motorcycling Australia Limited;
- d) "State Controlling Body" (SCB) means a state or territory motorcycling association affiliated as a member of MA;
- e) "Motorcycling Activities" means performing or participating in any capacity in any authorised or recognised Motorcycling Organisation event, meeting or activity;
- f) "Motorcycling Organisation" means and includes MA, and the MA members (including the SCBs and affiliated clubs) and where the context so permits, their respective directors, officers, members, servants or agents.

**3. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISKS, DANGERS & OBLIGATIONS**

I ACKNOWLEDGE that:

- a) motorcycle sport is dangerous and that by engaging in the sport (whether as a competitor, recreational rider, coach, official or media) at the Meeting I take and am exposed to certain risks and dangers and am under certain obligations as follows:
  - i) that I may be injured, physically or mentally, and may be killed;
  - ii) that my machinery or equipment may be damaged, lost or destroyed;
  - iii) that competitors may ride dangerously or with a lack of skill;
  - iv) that track or event conditions may be hazardous and may vary without warning or predictability;
  - v) that organisers, officials, landowners/track operators and any agents or representatives of those in charge of meetings are frequently obliged to make decisions under pressure of time/or events;
  - vi) that any policy of insurance of or in respect of my life or physical or mental health may be voided;
  - vii) that there may be no or inadequate facilities for treatment or transport of me if I am injured;
  - viii) that I have an obligation to myself and to others to act safely and within the rules and regulations of MA;
- b) the Indemnites do not make any warranty that the services at the Meeting will be provided with due care and skill or that any materials provided in connection with the services will be fit for the purpose for which they are supplied;
- c) to the extent that any warranty is implied it is excluded to the full extent permitted by law;
- d) have voluntarily read and understood this warning and accept and assume the inherent risks in participating in the Event.

**4. WARNING UNDER THE FAIR TRADING ACT 1999 (VIC)**

Under the provisions of the Fair Trading Act 1999 (Vic) several conditions are implied into contracts for the supply of certain goods and services. These conditions mean that the supplier named on this form is required to ensure that the recreational services it supplies to you are:

- rendered with due care and skill;
- as fit for the purpose for which they are commonly bought as it is reasonable to expect in the circumstances; and
- reasonably fit for any particular purpose or might reasonably be expected to achieve any result you have made known to the supplier.

Under section 32N of the Fair Trading Act 1999, the supplier is entitled to ask you to agree that these conditions do not apply to you. If you sign this form, you will be agreeing that your rights to sue the supplier under the Fair Trading Act 1999 if you are killed or injured because the services were not rendered with due care and skill or they were not reasonably fit for their purpose, are excluded, restricted or modified in the way set out in this form.

**NOTE:** The change to your rights, as set out in this form, does not apply if your death or injury is due to gross negligence on the supplier's part. "Gross negligence" is defined in the Fair Trading (Recreational Services) Regulations 2004.

For the purposes of the clause 3, "the Supplier" shall mean and include the Indemnites.

**5. INDEMNITY AND RELEASE GIVEN TO ORGANISERS**

IN CONSIDERATION of the acceptance of me as a participant in the Meeting:

- a) I AGREE TO INDEMNIFY AND KEEP INDEMNIFIED to the full extent permitted by law the Indemnites and each of them in the following manner:
  - i) that I participate in the meeting at my sole risk and responsibility;
  - ii) that I accept the Venue as it stands with all or any defects hidden or exposed;
  - iii) that I indemnify and hold harmless the Indemnites, their respective servants, agents, officials and competitors against any actions, costs, losses or claims which may be made by me or on my behalf for or in respect of or arising out of my death or any injury loss or damage caused to me or my equipment whether caused by negligence, breach of contract or in any other manner whatsoever.
- b) I AGREE TO RELEASE to the full extent permitted by law the Indemnites and each of them from all liability to me for any claim, loss, damage, cost or expense (whether arising under statute, from negligence, personal injury, psychological trauma, death, property damage or infringement of third party rights or otherwise) that arises as a result of any act, matter or thing done, permitted or omitted to be done by me or which is in any way connected with my presence at or involvement in the Event.
- 6. The release and indemnity provided by me in this declaration is in addition to, and will not in any way limit the application of, the conditions of sale attaching to tickets, conditions of entry, conditions of credentials or any other applicable terms or conditions in respect of the Event.
- 7. A term of this release and indemnity will not apply where the term contravenes the law of the relevant jurisdiction under which any legal action is legitimately taken however such terms are severable and do not invalidate the remaining terms.

**8. MEDICAL**

I declare that I am and must continue to be medically and physically fit and able to participate in the Meeting. I will immediately notify MA in writing via my SCB of any change to my fitness and ability to participate. I understand and accept the Indemnites will continue to rely upon this declaration as evidence of my fitness and ability to participate.

I acknowledge and agree that if required, the Indemnites (or any of them) may arrange medical or hospital treatment (including ambulance transportation) for me. I authorise such actions being taken by the Indemnites and agree to meet all costs associated with such action. I understand it is compulsory for me to have ambulance insurance in some form and I accept responsibility for the cost of ambulance transportation, ambulance cover and further agree to maintain ambulance cover during the term of my license / membership.

**10. PRIVACY**

I hereby consent to the collection of my personal information by the Promoter/Event Organiser, MA and the SCB in connection with my involvement at the Event and the use and disclosure of my personal information by Event Organiser, and MA to other agencies and officials associated with the Event for the purposes of conducting and managing the Event. I understand that I may gain access to my personal information held by contacting MA at 147 Montague St, South Melbourne, Victoria, 3205. I understand that if I do not provide the personal information requested above that I may not be permitted to participate in the Event.

**11. PERSONAL HEALTH INFORMATION**

I hereby agree with MA and the SCB that in consideration for my participation in the Event that MA and the SCB may receive, collect, store and use personal health information about me in the manner set out below:

- a) I ACKNOWLEDGE that:
- i) If I am injured, become ill or die at or following the Event the party listed at Item 8 in Schedule 1 in addition to any hospital at which I am treated (together "my Carers") will have health related information about me in their possession, power and control relating

to me which is subject to obligations imposed by the Privacy Act ("my Information") and the Privacy Act is intended to protect my personal information;

- ii) MA and my SCB wish to collect my Information for purposes that include their risk management programs, evaluating and improving the safety of MA and SCB events and of the Meeting organisers and facility providers of MA / SCB permitted events, and generally to reduce the risks to persons engaged in motorcycle sport; and
- iii) it is reasonable for MA and my SCB to collect, store, use and disclose my Information in accordance with clause 11(a)(i) above and in the manner set out in clause 11(b).
- b) IN CONSIDERATION of my acceptance as an entrant in the Meeting I consent and agree that MA and my SCB:
  - i) may collect and store any of my Information, including obtain my Information from third parties including my Carers;
  - ii) may use any information collected in accordance with this clause for any purpose consistent with creating safer competition in motorcycle sport and events held by or in conjunction with MA, my SCB, or with an MA or SCB permit;
  - iii) may disclose my Information to third parties provided such disclosure is reasonably intended to be used for the purpose of improving safety at events held by or in conjunction with MA, or with an MA permit provided any such information is held by MA or my SCB in accordance with the MA Privacy Policy.
- c) I irrevocably authorise MA and my SCB and hereby appoint MA and my SCB as my lawful attorneys to collect from my Carers, and I hereby direct my Carers to provide to MA or my SCB upon request being made by MA or my SCB, any of my Information including but not limited to any information concerning any incident or event causing or contributing to or resulting from any injury, illness or death to me, the details of any diagnosis and prognosis provided to me by my Carers (or any party with the knowledge of any of my Carers), and any other matter to the knowledge of my Carers that might reasonably be considered to be requested by MA or my SCB for the purpose of improving safety at MA and SCB events.
