The classes on offer at Round 2 give riders of a wide variety of machinery types and an opportunity to test their mettle on track. So give them a wave and if they have any energy left on their cool down lap they will try to wave back.



In a club first, the Formula 2 (Supersport) grid has hit capacity, and the Formula 1 (Superbike) class has record entry numbers. With 22 Formula 1 bikes, from 8 different manufacturers, fans have a real variety of bikes and riders to enjoy in the top tier class! This weekend has turned into a real preview of what's to come in April when ASBK comes to Morgan Park Raceway.
